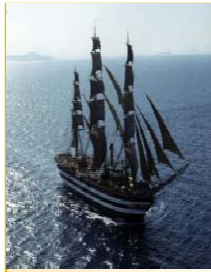

**Dr. Ferdinando Fasce** is Full Professor of North American History at the University of Genoa, where he also teaches Modern and Contemporary History. A social and cultural historian, he is corresponding editor for Italy of the *Journal of American History*. Recipient of grants and scholarships from the American Council of Learned Societies, the Fulbright Commission, and the Hagley Museum and Library, he has been awarded the Organization of American Historians Foreign-Language Book Prize. Among his publications, that include five books in Italian, the monograph *An American Family. Corporate Culture and the Great War in America* (Columbus, Ohio State University Press, 2002).
