Founded in 1956, the Universidad del Salvador stresses human and social concerns in all of its academic programs. In addition to broad coverage of academic and professional subjects, the university places special emphasis on the study of Latin America. The Universidad del Salvador also has a diversified international student body from countries such as the United States, Mexico, Canada, Japan, and many more.

The main buildings are located in the city's central district. In addition to the downtown location, the Universidad del Salvador has other branches including Pilar, located on the outskirts of the city, where students may play a number of sports such as soccer, tennis, basketball, volleyball, rowing, and sailing. All coursework is in Spanish.

The Universidad Torcuato di Tella (UTDT) was founded in 1991 and offers undergraduate degrees in law, economics, business administration, political science and government, and international studies. It is fast expanding with close to 1,000 undergraduate and 1,000 graduate students.

Located in the pleasant urban setting of the Belgrano neighborhood of central Buenos Aires, UTDT is housed in one large building which has computer facilities and one of the most important social sciences libraries in the country with a number of original and rare collections. All coursework is in Spanish, so students must have an advanced command of the language.

The Universidad de San Andres (UDESA), founded in 1989, is located about 40 minutes by commuter train north of the center of the Argentine federal capital of Buenos Aires. Its suburban campus is situated by the shores of the Rio de la Plata. The campus itself is small, with easy access to its modern facilities that include an up-to-date library and computer center. Several student organizations offer opportunities in intramural sports and other recreational activities.

UDESA's faculty members are all highly regarded within their fields, with most professors holding doctoral degrees. Most professors offer regular office hours and are more accessible than faculty at other larger Argentine universities. All coursework is in Spanish, so students must have an advanced command of the language. A full load is four courses per semester.

Students may opt to live in a suburban residence close to campus or in downtown Buenos Aires, which would entail a reverse commute by train to Victoria.

Requirements

- Completed application, signed by your academic advisor
- Essay
- Two faculty recommendations
- Official transcript
- Foreign language evaluation form
- Personal interview
- \$500 nonrefundable deposit is due upon acceptance (deducted from the program cost)

Academic Credit

Students are registered at the University of Miami and earn 12-18 undergraduate credits per semester. Upon completion of the courses overseas, a transcript from the overseas university will be sent to the IEEP office. The grades and credits will be converted to UM grades and credits according to the Grading Scale established by International Admission. The course titles, grades, and credits will be reported to the Registrar and placed on your UM transcript. Non-UM students will receive a UM transcript, and one will be sent to the Registrar of your home university.

Personal Expenses

Personal expenses such as laundry, entertainment, and local transportation are approximately \$2,000 per semester in addition to those listed above. Additional expenses will vary according to spending habits and travel. The total cost of room and board, books, supplies, and personal expenses are estimates and may vary depending on the rate of exchange at the time of study.

Travel Arrangements

Students are responsible for making their own travel arrangements.

Financial Aid

Most forms for University of Miami financial aid are available to UM students studying abroad. Students receiving financial aid from other institutions should contact their own financial aid office. Medical Insurance

Participants are required to secure health insurance to provide adequate coverage for any injuries and/or illnesses that they may sustain or experience while participating in the program, including coverage for medical evacuation and repatriation of remains.

A valid passport is required for travel abroad. Student visa information will be provided upon acceptance.
