Yonsei University was established in 1885, and it is the oldest university in Korea. The university is located 20 minutes away from the cultural, economic, and political centers of downtown Seoul. Its student body is comprised of the top one percent of high school graduates in Korea. The university's commitment to academic excellence and internationalization has attracted top-level international students to study at Yonsei. There are approximately 50 undergraduate courses taught in English as well as regular courses taught in Korean. Korean language courses are offered at the Korean Language Institute.

Among the services and facilities for international students is the Global Lounge which is wireless and provides study and seminar space in a comfortable environment. It also has satellite broadcasting systems providing news from 15 countries and multimedia space for cultural and academic events.

Application Deadlines

Fall: March 1
Spring: October 1

Requirements

- Completed application, signed by your academic advisor, and essay
- GPA: 3.0
- Two faculty recommendations
- Official transcript
- Personal or telephone interview
- \$500 nonrefundable deposit is due upon acceptance (deducted from program cost)

Travel Arrangements

Students are responsible for making their own travel arrangements.

Academic Credit

Students are registered at the University of Miami and may earn 12-18 undergraduate credits per semester for all approved courses. Upon completion of the courses overseas, a transcript from the overseas university will be sent to the IEEP office. The grades and credits will be converted to UM grades and credits according to the Grading Scale established by International Admission. The course titles, grades, and credits will be reported to the Registrar and placed on

your UM transcript. Non-UM students will receive a UM transcript, and one will be sent to the Registrar of your home university.

Financial Aid

Most forms for University of Miami financial aid are available to UM students studying abroad. Students receiving financial aid from other institutions should contact their financial aid office to determine if the aid is transferable.
