

Uppsala has the appeal of a vibrant university town-bicycles dominate the roads, and students make up approximately 15 percent of the city's population. Uppland, the province in which Uppsala is located, is rather flat, making bike riding and walking popular not only in town but also in the surrounding fields and forests. Located 70 km (45 miles) north of Stockholm, Uppsala is a city with a rich history. *Gamla Uppsala* (Old Uppsala) was the site of a pagan temple where sacrificial rites were performed to appease the Nordic deities 1,500 years ago.

Semester and Year Programs

Uppsala University, founded in 1477, is the oldest university in Scandinavia. Several famous scholars have worked at the University, including Carl von Linné and Anders Celsius. Since 1901 six Nobel prizes have been awarded to researchers at Uppsala University. The university library, Carolina Rediviva, is one of Scandinavia's best-equipped libraries for research in liberal arts with approximately five million volumes.

An important part of student life at Uppsala University is the system of student nations. There are thirteen student nation organizations dating back to the 17th century and named for the regions in Sweden, which are primarily clubs for students from the region. As a foreign student you may choose which nation you want to join. It is compulsory to join a nation since that is how you receive your student ID.

Uppsala University, with 44,000 students and more than 40 programs of study, offers many courses in English. Exchange students may study in Uppsala for either a semester or an academic year. One important difference in the academic system is that students at Uppsala University study single subject courses consecutively rather than concurrently as in the U.S. Many courses are taught in English.

Upon request, Uppsala University will reserve a room in one of several residence halls. Rent is paid directly to Uppsala on a monthly basis. In most student complexes, rooms are singles with private baths and there are shared kitchen and laundry facilities.

Personal expenses such as laundry, entertainment, and local transportation are approximately \$1,000 per semester. Additional student expenses will vary according to individual spending habits and travel. Expenses also may increase or decrease depending on the exchange rate at the time of study.

Living in Sweden is quite expensive. The Swedish Consulate estimates a monthly budget (including food, accommodation, student fees, books, personal expenses) of approximately \$1,000.

Requirements

- Completed application, signed by your academic advisor
- Essay

- Two faculty recommendations
- Official transcript
- Personal interview
- \$500 nonrefundable deposit is due upon acceptance (deducted from program cost)

Academic Credit

Students are registered at the University of Miami and earn 12-18 undergraduate or credits per semester for all approved courses. Upon completion of the courses overseas, a transcript from the overseas university will be sent to the IEEP office. The grades and credits will be converted to UM grades and credits according to the Grading Scale established by International Admission. The course titles, grades, and credits will be reported to the Registrar and placed on your UM transcript. Non-UM students will receive a UM transcript, and one will be sent to the Registrar of your home university.

Travel Arrangements

Students are responsible for making their own travel arrangements.

Financial Aid

Most forms for University of Miami financial aid are available to UM students studying abroad. Students receiving financial aid from other institutions should contact their financial aid office to determine if the aid is transferable. UM degree-seeking students should also apply for travel stipends to help with the living and travel costs associated with study abroad. Students should also check the study abroad website for other scholarships that may be applicable for their study abroad program: www.miami.edu/studyabroad.

Medical Insurance

Participants are required to secure health insurance to provide adequate coverage for any injuries and/or illnesses that they may sustain or experience while participating in the program, including coverage for medical evacuation and repatriation of remains.

Passport and Visa

A valid passport is required for travel abroad. Students should inquire at the U.S. Passport Agency in their city or contact their local U.S. Post Office for information. Student visa information will be provided upon acceptance.
