

PDF Documents for Electronic Submission

For electronic submission of proposals using Grants.gov and for electronic submission to many other agencies you will need to convert your proposal documents into PDF format. Most of us already have Adobe Reader, a free download that lets you view PDF documents, but Adobe Reader will not convert your proposal package into PDF format. The Adobe Acrobat 7.0 software may be purchased to do this conversion. The University of Miami has negotiated a reduced price for faculty and staff, and you can purchase the software through Medical Information Technology on the Medical campus or from the Technology Product Center located on the Coral Gables campus.

There are two versions of Adobe Acrobat, the Standard version and the Professional version. The Standard version will convert documents including text, graphs, charts and pictures. The Professional version has the additional ability to bring in data from Visio, AutoCAD, and Microsoft Project, and it can be used to create forms. Most will find that the Standard version is sufficient, but you should decide depending on the complexity of your work. The software is licensed per person so you can have a copy on your desktop computer as well as your laptop. The Adobe Standard version runs about \$25, and the Professional version around \$40 per person. Licensing allows you to use the software at home for University work, but if you leave the University you are required to uninstall the software and submit a signed letter stating that you have removed the Adobe software from your home computer.

Medical Information Technology will install the software on your computer at the Medical campus; if you want to install the software at home there is an additional charge of \$24 to receive the installation CD. The Coral Gables Technology Product Center does not install Adobe Acrobat, and you are required to purchase the installation CD for \$24 as well as the per person license. If purchasing from the Technology Product Center we suggest that you purchase per person licenses for the entire department and a single CD to help keep your costs down. The Adobe software is significantly more expensive if you purchase from outside of the University of Miami so please utilize the licensing agreements the University has in place.

For departments with Lanier multi-function copiers the scanning feature will also convert your printed document into a PDF format. You can avoid the cost of the Adobe software, but have alternative plans in the event your Lanier is not working when it's time to submit. Purchasing and installation of Adobe software might take up to one week, so give yourself sufficient time to get everything ready for your electronic submission.
